Sister of Mrs. R. J. Nelson Of Robersonville; Many Attend Final Rites

Funeral services for Mrs. Sallie Bunting, 68, were conducted last Thursday afternoon at 3:30 at the Bethel Methodist church by the pastor, Rev. W. L. Clegg, assisted by Rev. J. O. Long, of Weidon, and Rev. Leslie Newman, pastor of the Bethel Baptist church. Interment was made in the Bethel cemetery.

Mrs. Bunting, prior to her marriage, was Miss Sallie Taylor, daughter of the late Burton H. Taylor and Martha Mayo Taylor, of Edgecombe County. In January, 1888, she married the late John R. Bunting, of Bethel, who died in June, 1931.

In early life Mrs. Bunting joined

the Methodist church and was a loyal and faithful member, rarely ever being absent from a service. She entered wholeheartedly into the various activities of the church and the community in which she lived.

Surviving her are four daughters, Mrs. H. V. Staton, Mrs. D. C. Carson, Mrs. Claude James, and Miss Thelma Bunting, of Bethel; and five sons, Z. V., S. G., J. B., and Vernon Bunting, of Bethel; and Alvin Bunting, of Greenville; two brothers, W. W. Taylor and R. I. Taylor, of Bethel; and one sister, Mrs. R. J. Nelson, of Robersonville.

A large delegation of friends and relatives from here attended the funeral and listed among the honorary pall-bearers was Mr. W. H. Adkins, a friend of the family.

### Amount of Manure For Home Garden

The amount of manure to be applied to the home garden plot of course depends upon the size of the plot, but on soils of average fertility, about 10 two-horse wagon loads should be used to the acre. One load, therefore, would cover a space approximately 50 by 100 feet. Be sure that the manure is well rotted before applying. Where it is desirable to use a combination of manure and superphosphate for the garden soil the 10 loads of manure should be supplemented with from two to three bags of superphosphate.

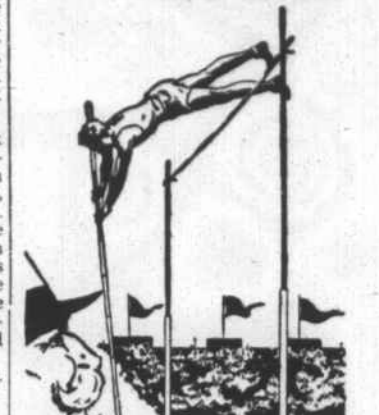
