

### Leaflet Advertising State's Playgrounds Being Distributed

A new booklet, profusely illustrated with as fine an assortment of photographs of North Carolina scenes as has ever been put together, entitled "North Carolina—Variety Vacationland" is being distributed by the Department of Conservation and Development.

The photographs were selected and the layout and text prepared by Assistant Director Paul Kelly and Cecil Bell, of the publicity division, and the booklet as a whole maintains the very high standards which the department has consistently maintained for years under the guidance of publicityman Kelly and his staff.

The booklet was authorized by former Governor J. C. B. Ehringhaus months ago and should have been ready many weeks ago. It was delayed by the printing company, but the printing job is very good.

Beginning with some very fine photographs of the Carolina coast country including—scenes on Roanoke Island, Hatteras, Ocracoke Island, Kitty Hawk, the Dismal Swamp, beaches and other places of interest such as Fort Macon.

There are pictures of the upper coastal plain and piedmont sections of the State, showing fox chases, steeple chases in the sandhills, golfing, scenes and field trails, with an intersprinkling of pictures of places of historical significance including the State Capitol illuminated at night. The latter part of the booklet is devoted to western North Carolina.

### Return of Prosperity Brings Increases in Birth Rate of State

Raleigh.—With the return of prosperity a definite increase in the number of babies being born in North Carolina is reflected in figures compiled by the division of vital statistics of the State Board of Health.

Reports for the first six months of 1937, as compared with the first half of 1936 show that 39,979 babies

have already been born in North Carolina this year, as compared with 38,875 the same period last year, a difference of 1,104 in favor of 1937. The trend has been upward since 1935, prior to which time there was a decrease in births, following a decided increase just after the war, when prosperity was at its height.

North Carolina also continues to show a declining death rate. The number of deaths reported by the vital statistics division the first half of 1937 was 17,598. This was in contrast with 18,874 reported the corresponding period in 1936, a difference of 1,276 in favor of 1937.

Decided increases in births were reported during April, May and June, this year, while slight decreases were evident during January, February and March, though the net gain stands at 1,104.

During only one month this year—April—have there been more deaths than last year.

### Cut Cowpeas for Hay As Pods Begin To Yellow

The best time to cut cowpeas for hay is when the first pods begin to yellow. This gives a hay of high quality with not too much woody material. Cure as rapidly as possible because over-curing causes the leaves to fall off and leaches out the green color.

### Grain Not Necessary For Dry Dairy Cows

If there is plenty of good pasture available and the animal is in good flesh, no other feed will be necessary for a dairy cow during the dry period, but the animal should have free access to a good mineral mixture, unless the grazing is legume crops or hay is being fed. If the pasture is short or the cow in poor flesh enough concentrate should be fed to put the animal in good flesh before freshening. However, all high protein grains and corn is usually removed from the grain ration about two weeks before freshening. A good grain mixture to feed during this period is composed of equal parts of wheat, bean and ground oats.

### Mitchell Farmers Average \$7.07 Per Head for Lambs
