Greenville Market Will Close Season Next Week

At a meeting of the executive committee of the Greenville Tobacco Board of Trade last Tuesday, it was decided to keep the Greenville market open three days of next week closing for the season Wednesday, December 20. The board, in taking this action, stated that practically all this year's crop would be disposed of by Friday but some few growers would find difficulty in preparing the last leaf by that time and it was the desire of the Greenville tobaccoists to accommodate these men by giving them an opportunity to clean out their barns. 1939 has proved to be the greatest year in the history of the Greenville market, 78,553,120 pounds of tobacco having been sold through Tuesday for \$12,374,459.22, averaging \$16.39 per hundred. This is over 7,000,000 pounds more than was sold in 1938.
