One-Third Of Sales Yields Two-Thirds Of Net Profits
The 78 largest manufacturing corporations received 69.4 per cent of the net profits taken by all manufacturing corporations in 1933 although their gross sales were only 33.8 per cent of the total for all manufacturing corporations. Thus they received more than two-thirds of the total net profits for handling one-third of all sales.
These findings are presented by the National Resources Committee, a federal research agency in Washington.

These 78 largest corporations engaged in manufacturing constitute less than one-twentieth of one per cent of all manufacturing corporations.

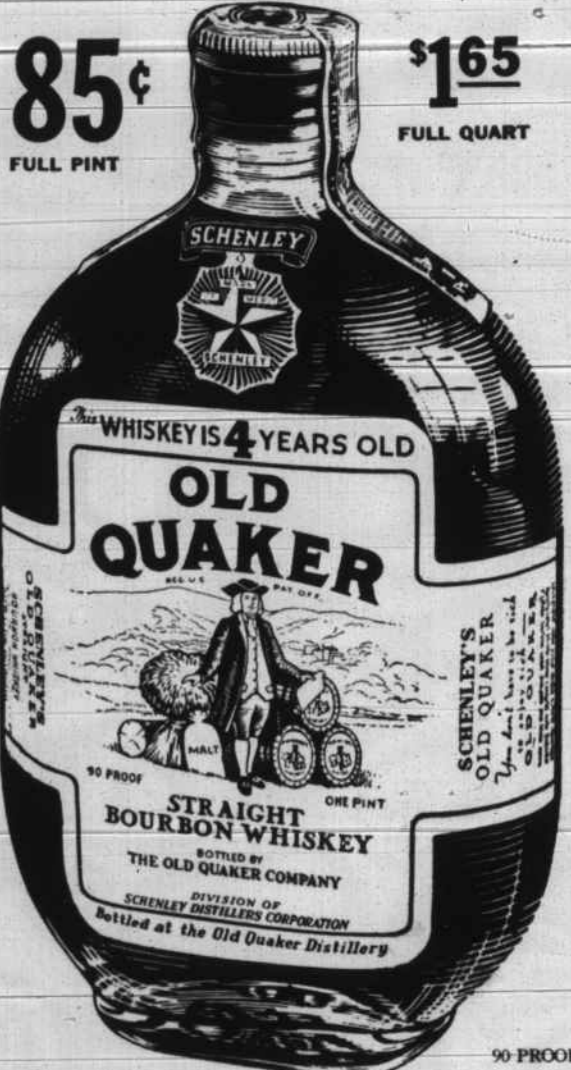
