Completion of a number of improvements last week prepared the way for formal opening of Albemarle Beach with a dance Friday night, May 31, the music to be provided by Hal Thurston and his orchestra, it was announced today by L. W. Gurkin, owner of the popular resort which is located on Albemarle Sound near Mackeys. It was formerly known as Rae's Beach. The gala opening this year will be a week later than last year because of weather conditions, but Mr. Gurkin said that with Hal Thurston and his band succeeding Brookes Fryer's band of last season he expects the 1940 opening will be largely attended. Vacationists will find the beach an even better place to spend their leisure time, according to Mr. Gurkin, who said the walkway had been extended to the second pier and that with new paint and improved buildings the place would be much more attractive. Four cottages will be available for those who wish to spend their time at the beach this summer. And if the need is equal to last year there will be times when this will not be enough. As usual, bathing and boating with dancing will be the main features of the resort, with other recreational activities at times during the season.
