## HINTS FOR HOMEMAKERS

### SUGAR AND SPICE

"Sugar and spice and all things nice"  
That's what these pickles are made of.

### Spiced Cucumbers

12 ripe cucumbers  
1 1-2 cups sugar  
2 cups vinegar  
1 tsp salt  
1 tsp cloves, whole  
1 tsp allspice, whole  
2 tsp cinnamon bark  
1 tsp white mustard seed

Cut cucumbers into slices 1 inch thick or in lengthwise strips. Place in a bowl and sprinkle with 1-2 cup salt. Let stand overnight. Drain and wash in cold water. Mix the sugar, vinegar and spices and boil for five minutes. Add cucumbers and cook mixture slowly until tender. When done the cucumbers should be clear in appearance, and the liquid should be the consistency of a medium thick syrup. Pack in clean hot jars and seal immediately.

### Pickled Watermelon Rind

Soak 2 pounds watermelon overnight in salt water (3 tablespoons salt to 1 quart water). Drain off brine and cook watermelon rind in clear water until tender. Make a syrup of 2 cups sugar, 2 cups water, 2 cups vinegar, 1 lemon, sliced thin, 1 tablespoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon cloves, and 1 teaspoon allspice. Add rind to hot solution and boil rapidly until rind is clear. Pack in clean, hot jars and seal immediately.

### Green Pepper Relish

2 dozen green peppers  
1-2 dozen red peppers  
1 quart onions  
1 large head cabbage  
Chop above ingredients or if you prefer, grind through coarse blade of food chopper. Put 5 tablespoons salt in mixture and let stand 30 minutes. Squeeze and add to spiced vinegar made of:

1 1-2 quarts vinegar; 2 lbs sugar; 1 oz. mixed spices (tied in cloth bag).

Boil vinegar mixture 30 minutes. Add chopped mixture and boil 30 minutes. Pack in hot clean jars and seal at once.

### Mixed Mustard Pickles

1 medium cauliflower  
2 green peppers  
1 red pepper  
2 cups small white onions  
2 lbs. green tomatoes  
2 cups very small cucumbers  
4 cups unpared cucumber slices,  
1-8 inch thick  
1 cup salt  
6 cups cold water  
3 pts. vinegar  
2 cups granulated sugar  
2 tsp celery seed  
3-4 cup sifted all-purpose flour  
1-4 lb. dry mustard (1 1-4 cups)  
3-4 tsp turmeric

Wash the cauliflower and break into small flowerets. Wash and seed the peppers, cut in halves, then in 1-4 inch crosswise slices. Pour boiling water over the onions, let stand 5 minutes, then skin. Wash and cut tomatoes in eighths. Mix the cauliflower, peppers, onions, tomato sections, whole small cucumbers, and cucumber slices in a large bowl. Cover with a brine made by combining the salt and 4 cups of cold water. Let stand overnight; in the morning bring just to a boil in the same water. Drain. Meanwhile heat the vinegar, sugar and celery seed to the boiling point. Mix the flour, mustard, and turmeric to a paste with the remaining 2 cups water; add this to the hot vinegar mixture while stirring constantly. Add to the drained vegetables and cook uncovered 20 minutes, stirring constantly. Turn into hot sterilized preserve jars and seal. Makes 7 pints.
