With the completion of more than 500 projects in the current slum clearance and national defense housing program of the United States Bousing Authority, about 512,000 building trades jobs will have been provided on sites in around 230 localities. Wages will total approximately \$225,000,000 and about \$280,-100,000 will be expended for construction materials. Approximately 180,000 low-rent homes for low-income families will be provided.
