We are classed as an inferior race and therefore should be subservient to Germany. When we went into hysteria last winter over a radio program on the end of the world, the Germans said. Well, those imbeciles can easily be conquered." I would say that unless we become stronger than we are, it is not only possible for Germany to attack us, but it is very probable that she will, if England col-




