

Marshall is probably the strongest club in West Virginia this year, undefeated in the first four games, and advance notices from the Herd drum beaters indicate it is stronger than the '39 aggregation that bare ly lost to Wake Forest 14-13.

Interest is running high at Huntington, W. Va., home of the Herd, for a victory over the Deacons. large delegation of Marshall backers have announced plans for attending the game, one group even chartering a special plane for the trip.

Main reason for the visitors' en-

thusiasm is that only four regulars are gone from last year's club, and the fact that Coach Cam Henderson will be able to match experience with experience, power with power, and probably his passing attack. which was so deadly to the Deacons last year, will be superior.
