1-2 tsp salt 3 to 4 c flour

Blend the sugar with fat and add eggs well beaten. To this mixture add alternately the milk and dry ingredients, adding the baking pow-der and salt to first cup of flour. Roll lightly and cut with doughnut cutter. Fry in hot fat and drain on brown paper. Cool.

Topping

3-4 c brown sugar 1 tbsp flour 1-3 c water

Shredded coconut.

Heat to the boiling point the sugar, flour and water. Cook until the mixture forms a soft ball when a little is dropped into cold water. With a teaspoon place a narrow band of yrup on top of each doughnut. Turn upside down in a plate of coconut, alowing as much coconut as possible to stick
