All official and teaching positions were turned over to the teachers of the county schools. Following the Sunday school, R. G. Gaither delivered a special address. Other talks were made by Don Chance, J. A. Holley, Ruth Downing, Rebecca Ev-erett and Fannie Slade.

Rev. L. T. Bond, pastor of the church, delivered the regular 11 c'clock sermon. He was followed by

ary Gray, supervisor of the Mar County Negro schools. At 2:30 p. m., Rev. J. A. S. Cole, pastor of the Williamston Chapel Zion Church, spoke on, "Build on the Solid Rock."

The final service of the day began at 7:30 p. m., in what was said to be a fitting climax to the second annual eachers' day. Music was furnished by two groups of singers, both being composed of members of the WPA organization of Williamston. The principal addresses of the evening were made by E: S. Peel, local attor-ney, and J. C. Manning, county sup-

crintendent of schools. The address of Mr. Peel definitely appealed to the spiritual as well as the civic in his discourse to the teachers. He spoke of democracy as it af-




