Cotton-Lined Irrigation Canal



Comparatively inexpensive and virtually as effective as concrete a lining of cotton fabric and asphalt is being laid in this irrigation ditch near Grace. Idaho Prior to this lining the canal sustained a water loss of from 20 to 30 per cent for years. After being lined with cotton fabric and asphalt, the average annual loss was only four tenths of one oer cent. The National Cotton Council points to irrigation ditch lining as one of many new farm uses for cotton which may eventually consume bundreds of thousands of bales a year.
