HINTS FOR HOMEMAKERS

Tis the week before Easter and everyone is rushing about preparing for the Easter Parade. Those lovely spring things that do so much for one—Easter meals are important also. The family must be nourished and Easter meals have to be planned. Try this menu:

Fruit Cup
Cranberry Jelly Egg Nest Salad
Sweet Potatoes with Fruits
Buttered Asparagus Hot Rolls
Boston Cream Pie

Arrange crisp thin carrot sticks on lettuce leaf to form a nest. Place three little cream cheese eggs rolled in chopped parsley or chives—coarsely shredded cabbage also makes a good nest.

Boston Cream Pie
Shortening, 1 tsp
Milk, 1-2 cup
Flour, sifted, 1 cup
Baking powder, 1 tsp
Salt, 1-2 tsp
Eggs, well beaten, 2
Sugar, 1 cup
Vanilla, 1 tsp

Add shortening to milk and heat over hot water. Sift flour with baking powder and salt. Beat eggs until this kind light; beat in sugar gradually. Add vanilla, then beat in hot milk gradually. Fold in flour and blend thoroughly. Pour batter into greased 9-inch cake pan 1-2 inches deep. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) 25 to 30 minutes. Split well warm and fill with custard cream filling. Frost with shiny chocolate frosting.

Custard Cream Filling
Sugar, 1-4 cup
Flour, 1-4 cup
Salt, 1-4 tsp
Milk, 2 cups
Butter, 2 tbsp
Eggs, 2 or egg yolks, 4 well beaten
Vanilla, 1-1-2 tsp

Mix sugar, flour and salt in top of double boiler. Add milk slowly to make a smooth mixture. Stir and cook over hot water until thick. Cover and cook 10 minutes. Add butter and well beaten eggs or egg yolks, mixing quickly. Cook 1 minute longer. Cool and add flavoring.

Shiny Chocolate Frosting
Chocolate, 1 square
Butter, 2 tsp
Top milk, 1-4 cup
Confectioners' sugar, about 1 cup
Vanilla, 1-2 tsp

Melt chocolate and butter slowly in milk and let stand until lukewarm. Add confectioners' sugar until of consistency to spread. Add vanilla. The frosting should be soft and glossy.
