

Martins To Meet Wilson's Tobs Here Saturday Durham Lookouts Will Return Here Sunday

Skipper Rodgers Will Send His Squad Against Everetts Today

Pete Kunis And Slim Gardner To Pitch Saturday

Miller and Hinton Will Be On The Mound Sunday Afternoon

Skipper Frank Rodgers believes in giving his squad plenty of real practice with the scheduling of exhibition contests for today, Saturday and Sunday. He believes his men are in shape and feels that exhibition contests will bring out mistakes that can be seen and corrected before the Coastal Plain League season opens here next Thursday.

This afternoon at 3.30 on the local diamond, the Martins will meet an All-Star team from Everetts. The Everetts team has been playing for several weeks in the county for this encounter. Ken Rymer and Nathan Edmondson will divide the mound duties for the Martins, and Rodgers has announced that Magee will fill the second base position in place of Tuckey injured Wednesday by a batted ball.

On Saturday afternoon at 3.30 in the local park, the Martins will engage Manager Bill Herring's Wilson Tobs. After getting off to a slow start against clubs training in this section, Wilson has shown much improvement, with the club promising to again be one of the leading teams in the championship race. Veteran Pete Kunis and Slim Gardner are scheduled to do the hurling for the locals. This will be the first opportunity fans have had to see Kunis in action this season and he is reported to be in the best of condition with his arm in excellent shape.

Return on Sunday afternoon with an improved ball club, the Durham Lookouts will meet the Rodgersmen in the final exhibition tilt of the training period. It is reported that the Lookouts will borrow several players from the strong Durham Lucky Strike team, and will bring along a good pitcher for Sunday's contest which will get underway at 3.00 o'clock. The Skipper listed Miller and Harts Hinton as the probable starting pitchers for this affair.

In commenting on the team, Skipper Rodgers announced that Clyde Pettus, young catcher from Mobile, Ala., had arrived, but he knew nothing about his record. Pettus was signed by the Martins on recommendation of Charlie "Donald Duck" Wilcox, last year's local receiver. Plantz, a catcher, has been turned loose, as have Richman and Elwood Brown.

KEN RYMER, youthful Canton (N. C.) ball player, is making his bow to the professional baseball world here next week, his heart and soul set on a successful diamond career. He is making his debut on the mound, Skipper Frank Rodgers explaining that he was not decided just now when he would start the promising rookie.

A brother to John Rymer, who played with Tarboro several years ago, Ken is entering the professional game after two successful seasons with the strong Champion Y team. He made up his mind to enter professional ball back in his high school days and it was then that he started getting his training. He plays the game from two angles, first from

the standpoint of enjoyment and, secondly, from the standpoint of a career. Last year he pitched eight games, winning five and losing three in a community league that offered strong competition.

Ken "chunks" right-handed and is perfectly built for work on the mound. He possesses the determination to keep working, and during the past few days of the Martins' training season, he has impressed Skipper Rodgers and the fan wolves. He is a bit reserved about his ability and other than stating he plans to give the Martins everything he is able to give, he lays no claim to the future.
