There's nothing more satisfying to the hostess than a well-stocked cupboard with row after row of delicious jams and conserves. Nothing adds more to that Sunday night supper than hot biscuits with fig preserves or grape conserve. These spreads are very simple to make if recipes are closely followed. Here are a few of our favorites. Fig Preserves

Select slightly under-ripe fruit. Place in bowl, cover with boiling at page 3.
