

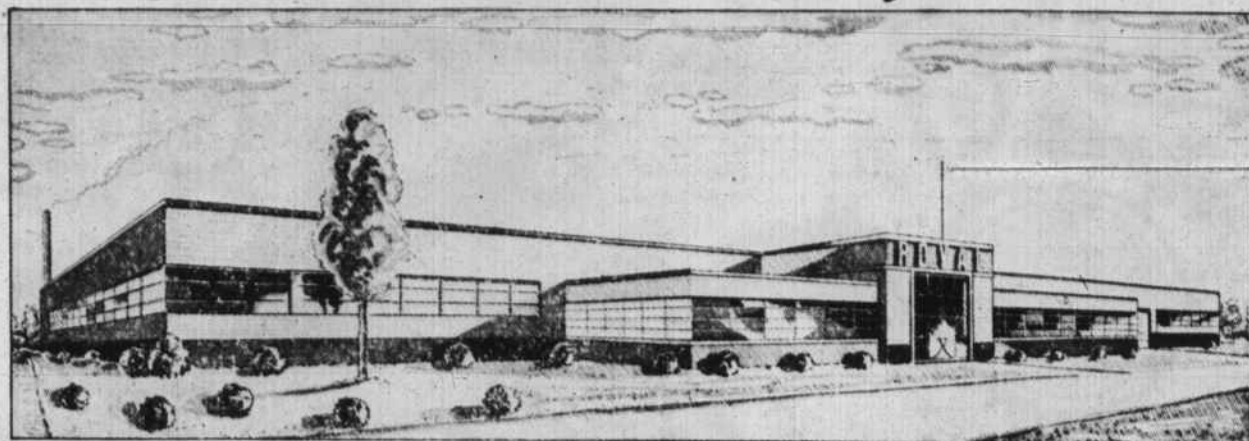
Eagles Lose Again As Martins Defeat E. C. T. C. Varsity

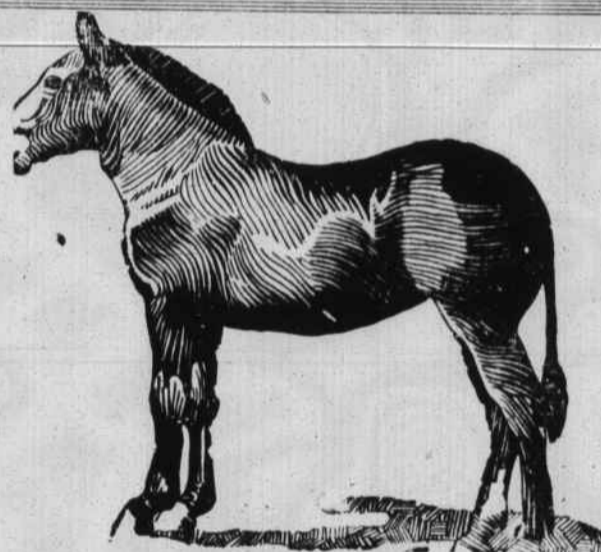

Firemen Called To Home On Simmons Avenue Here

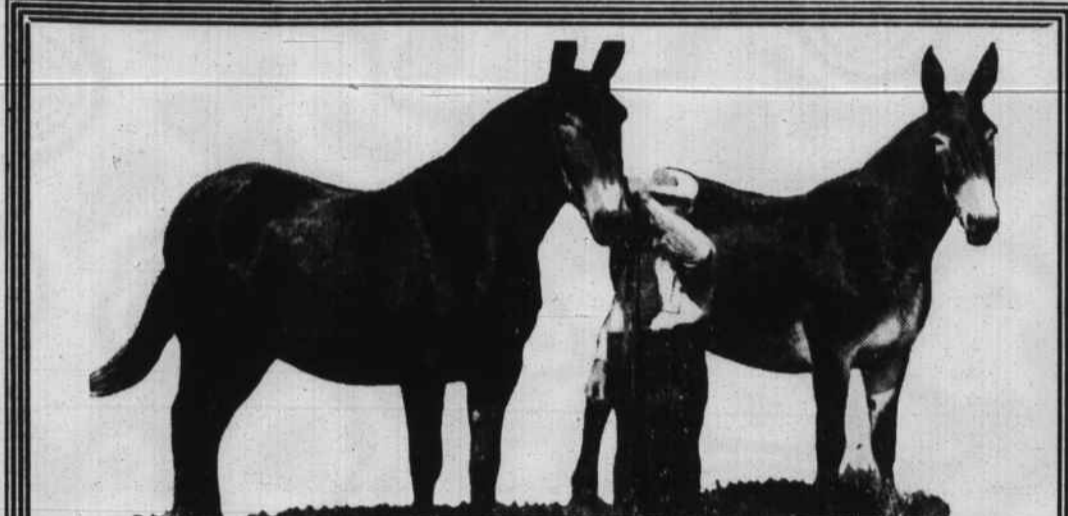

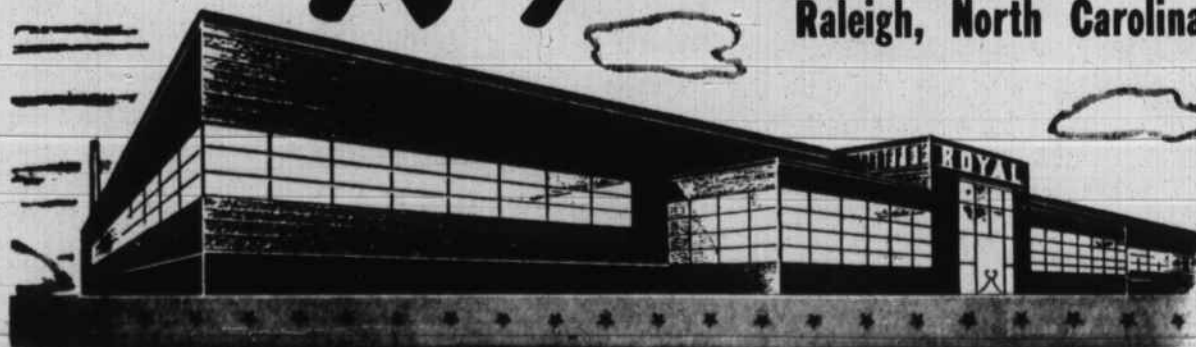
