Russians Thank Red Cross For Supplies

Moscow — Appreciation for the medical aid sent to Russia by the American Red Cross has been expressed here by Dr. Serge Alexiev-Kolesnikov, chairman of the executive committee of the Union of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies of the Soviet Union.

All deliveries of surgical instruments and other medical supplies from the United States are of first-rate quality, Dr. Kolesnikov said, and are arriving according to schedule. Mr. Robert J. Scovell, American Red Cross representative in

The extension of connections with medical organizations abroad would be useful for exchanging experience.
