

Extension Unit Offers Good Recipe For Making Sausage

North Carolina farm people have ound the sausage recipe in Extension Folder No. 34, "Killing and Curing Meat on the Farm," to be good. For 50 pounds of pork (threefourths lean and one-fourth fat) use one pound of fine table salt, 2 1-2 ounces of finely ground black pepper, and 3 ounces of sage. Mix these ingredients thoroughly and spread evenly over the meat. Then stir the meat well before chopping. A copy College, Raleigh.
