RULE 3

The bodies of those dead of Typhoid Fever, Puerperal Fever, Erysipelas, Tuberculosis, and Measles, or other dangerous communicable diseases other than those specified in Rules 1 and 2 may be received for transportation when prepared for shipment by filling cavities with an approved disinfectant, washing the exterior of the body with the same, stopping all orifices with absorbent cotton, and enveloping the entire body with a layer of cotton not less than one inch thick, and all wrapped in a sheet and bandaged and encased in an air-tight coffin or casket; provided that this shall apply only to bodies which can reach their destination within forty-eight hours from time of death. In all other cases such bodies shall be prepared for transportation in conformity with Rule 2 But when the body has been prepared for shipment by being thoroughly disinfected by a licensed embalmer holding a certificate, as in Rule 2, the airtight sealing and bandaging with cotton may be dispensed with.
