Anthracite Prospects

With the approach of September 1, when the contract between anthracite operators and miners expires, the probability of a strike in the hard coal industry appears to be steadily diminishing.

John Hays Hammond, chairman of the Coal Commission, after an interview with the President, announces that the Commission will receive Mr. Coolidge's "unqualified support" in its efforts to prevent a tie-up.

While the President prepares to call representatives of the operators and the miners to Washington to insist upon a settlement, there comes from Samuel D. Warriner, chairman of the operators' general committee, the statement that the employees are ready to arbitrate the question of the check-off.

Mr. Hammond's statement that the Coal Commission is convinced that non-anthracite fuel can fill the needs of the whole country if necessary is reassuring, whether there is a strike or not.
