"The solution of our educational and other problems" depend upon the recasting of our tax system, Miss Berry believes. "There-bould be a uniform state tax levy on all property, real and personal, corporate and consumers, for the support of a real public school system. This will have to be done before the country boys and girls, constituting from 60 to 70 percent of our people, can have educational opportunities commensurate with the city boys and girls." Miss Berry does not favor an additional tax on farm lands, but a tax on certain luxuries such as tobacco products, cold drinks, cosmetics, and other luxuries. The reorganization of the public school should be such as to make "uniform standards as regards teachers, books and coules. The solution of our education-


