## WOMEN FACING FOUR PROBLEMS OF LEGISLATION

### Miss Harriet Berry Points Out North Carolina's Outstanding Needs As She Has Seen Them

## RECAST TAX SYSTEM Re-organize School System, Promote Agriculture, and Protect Forests Are Major Tasks

Raleigh, Sept. 8. — For years North Carolina's problems, their solution, and the future possibilities of the state have been discussed by men. It is only within recent years that women have begun to take an active part in public life.

From the standpoint of a woman who has been in public life for the last 20 years, what are North Carolina's most important problems of today? What are the state's problems from the woman's standpoint?

They are four in number, according to one woman who has spent the last 20 years in North Carolina public life:

1. A recasting of our present tax system.
2. The reorganization of our public school system.
3. The promotion of agriculture through the perfecting of organizations in farm communities for efficient marketing, reasonable financing, etc.
4. Adequate protection of the existing forests and reforestation of out-over areas and barren lands.

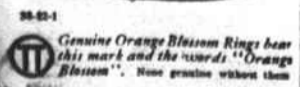
These are North Carolina's outstanding problems of today, in the judgment of Miss Harriet M. Berry, organizer of savings and loan associations, editor of the Market News, and secretary of the North Carolina Good Roads association.

Some of these problems "can be remedied with legislation," Miss Berry says; "others must be worked out by already existing agencies working with the people themselves."

"The solution of our educational and other problems" depend upon the recasting of our tax system, Miss Berry believes. "There should be a uniform state tax levy on all property, real and personal, corporate and consumers, for the support of a real public school system. This will have to be done before the country boys and girls, constituting from 60 to 70 per cent of our people, can have educational opportunities commensurate with the city boys and girls."

Miss Berry does not favor an additional tax on farm lands, but a tax on certain luxuries such as tobacco products, cold drinks, cosmetics, and other luxuries.

The reorganization of the public school should be such as to make "uniform standards as regards teachers, books and equipment for the country as well as the city children." This can come about, Miss Berry believes, only

## Sweater Expected Return With Two Piece Costume

### England Has Already Fallen Into Line and America Next; Wild Patterns Noticeably Absent in New Weaves of Turtle and Crew Neck Designs

New York, Sept. 8. — Merchandisers are counting extensively on the return to popularity of the sweater this fall. England has already fallen into line during the height of the shooting season and the vogue for two piece costumes lends itself specially to the sweater vogue. In most instances the new sweaters are of fine weave and of the turtle neck or crew neck designs. Wild patterns are noticeable absent.

**Flat Bags**  
Whether of silk or of leather, the smart handbags today are sure to match or harmonize with the costume with which they are carried. The flat envelope types prevail although threatened to a certain extent by the pouch bags of moire silk.

**Masques on Pockets**  
Many people wonder where the masque pocket, on the youthful two piece frocks originated. Well, they ascended directly from the garters. The odd, distorted embroideries, fashioned after a Green masque, were first used in miniature on the garters and there seems no telling where they will halt.

**Capes Reversible**  
Perhaps a fair majority of the new evening capes are being so constructed that they are reversible. In the formal evening wraps the richer furs form one side and the most gorgeous of metal brocades, velvets and metal embroidered satins are utilized for the other.

**Don't Shoot The Cuffs**  
The white and natural chambray wash leather gloves which have been so popular during the summer are not going into retirement. Rather they are being given a new lease on life through the addition of short flaring cuffs of contrasting color frequently embroidered. The loose pull on mod-

erns as the tax system is improved. "North Carolina's advantages in soil, climate, and geographical location should enable her to become one of the largest factors in the great eastern consuming centers," Miss Berry believes. But to accomplish this there must be worked out "for each farm community an agricultural program which will put farming on a business-like and efficient basis."

Forest conservation and reforestation will develop a tremendous source of revenue in the course of 25 or 30 years, Miss Berry says, but "there must be a well defined and continuous policy of protection and reconstruction."
