NEW YORK COTTON

New York, Aug. 11.—(AP)—The cotton market showed continued nervousness and irregularity today, but after losing a sharp early advance, turned firmer on unfavorable weather reports.

December sold up from 19.70 to 20.02 and was ruling around 19.96 at mid-afternoon with the general market showing net gains of about 2 1/2 points.

priced pool specialties broke from 5 to 15 points while declines of 1 to 3 points took place throughout the normal list.

The break in Manhattan Electrical Supply came while the stock exchange was investigating reports of a "technical corner." In that issue following its sensational advance from a low of 53 1/8 this year to a high of 132 a few weeks ago. The stock closed last night at 120 1/2; fluctuated erratically within a five point range in the first hour, then broke precipitously to 75, rallied above 80 and then collapsed again to 64 1/2 early in the afternoon.

Houston Oil dropped 15 1/4 points to 128 and rallied to 135; Timken Roller Bearing dropped 10 to 123 1/2 and snapped back to 130 and DuPont Commercial Solvents "B" and Delaware and Hudson sold down five points or more.

Call money was plentiful at 3 3/4 per cent.
