

### Camden Cops Score Point Over Rival Federal Agents

Judson Pritchard and Will Davis, two of Camden County's newly appointed deputy sheriffs, are crowing over the Federal prohibition agents as the result of a raid Thursday that netted them a large still at the Distal Swamp Canal locks, within shouting distance of South Mills. They also arrested Frank Kelly of South Mills, about 39 years old.

Kelly was held under \$200 bond for trial in rector's court Saturday before Trial Justice Overby, at Camden Courthouse. The preliminary hearing was held Thursday afternoon before Justice of the Peace G. F. Spence, at South Mills.

Besides the still, which was equipped with an upright boiler and two 40-foot copper worms, the deputy sheriffs seized 1,100 gallons of mash and five gallons of whiskey.

Pritchard and Davis are two of four new deputies appointed a few weeks ago by Sheriff Forbes, of Camden County, with the expressed purpose of breaking up the liquor traffic in the upper part of the county. An immediate rivalry developed between them and Federal dry officers operating in that territory, and both groups have claimed credit for the destruction of stills wrecked recently.

In this last case, according to authoritative advice from South Mills, there can be no question as to who is entitled to credit for the raid. The populace was given ample opportunity to view the fruits of the foray, part of which were dumped unceremoniously into the canal.

The dispatches from Grand Aids, Quebec, fail to state whether any of the newspaper men were injured by the tableware thrown by Mrs. Stillman, Sr. There wasn't a line either about whether or not the newspaper men were mangled men.

### NEW YORK STOCKS

New York, Aug. 12.—(AP)—Collapse of several pool specialties, following announcement of a stock exchange failure as the result of yesterday's sensational decline in Manhattan Electrical Supply, unsettled today's stock market, which had opened with a display of strength. Extreme declines in a dozen issues reported to be under pool sponsorship ran from 8 to 23 points although supporting orders were quickly supplied for a few by inside interests. Outside news was again forgotten as the market tried to correct the weak spots revealed in the day's trading. Heavy liquidation took place for both accounts, with the leading commission houses urging their customers to get out of the volatile issues and restrict commitments to the seasoned dividend payers until the corrective process showed signs of being completed.

The closing was weak. Total sales approximated 2,500,000 shares.
