## NOTICE OF LETTING OF DRAINAGE CONTRACT.

The Board of Drainage Commissioners of Drainage district No 4 of Washington County, N. C., will on July 29, 1913, at one o'clock P. M. at Roper, N. C., let the contract for the construction of about fifteen miles of drainage ditches requiring approximately the excavation of 482,863 cubic yards of earth and other work connected therewith in drainage district no. 4 of Washington county as described in final report of the engineer and viewers filed with the clerk of the superior court of Washington county N. C. on June 5th, 1913, together with plans and specifications of said work.

Scaled bids in writings must be filed with J. W. Chesson, vice chairman of the Board at Roper, N. C. on or before noon July 29th, 1913. The contract will be let to the lowest responsible bidder either as a whole or in sections as the board of drainage commissioners may decide will be most advantageous for the district. The successful bidder must execute a bond in favor of the commissioners of the district to the amount of 25 per cent of the estimated cost of the work awarded to him for the faithful performance of his contract and he shall have a dredge in operation on the ground within ten days after the contract has been awarded to him. The entire work must be completed by Nov. 1st, 1914. The Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

## CERTIFICATE OF DISSOLUTION.

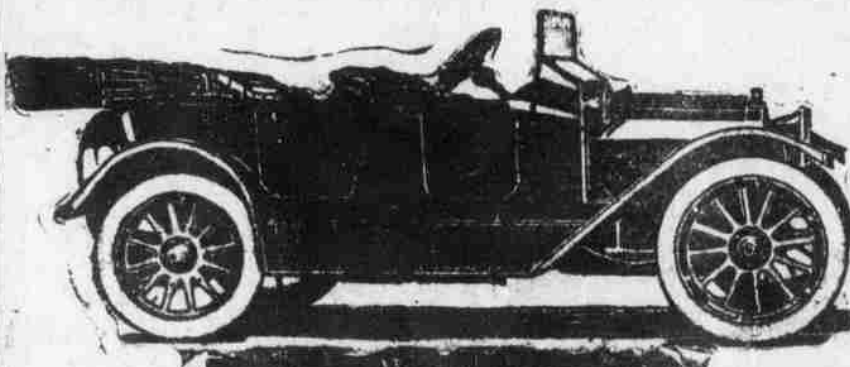
To All to Whom These Presents Shall Come—GREETING:

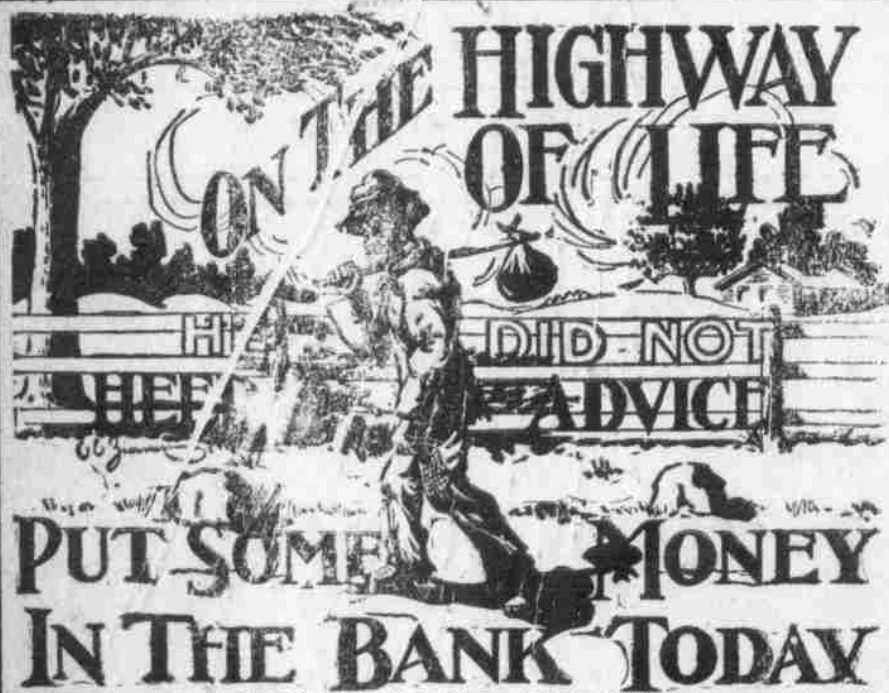
