

raeus, the port of Athens. A dispatch from Athens says it is probable that the Greek elections set for October 8 will be postponed for a fortnight.

The Greek garrisons at Saloniki, at Vodena and at Fort Little Waraburun have surrendered to a committee which has taken over the administration of part of Greek Macedonia, according to dispatches from Saloniki.

The revolt in Saloniki is confirmed by the British foreign office. Greeks friendly to the Entente, surrounded the barracks of the Greek infantry in Saloniki and are said to have exchanged shots with them. General Carrail, Allied commander at Saloniki, intervened to prevent further bloodshed. Russian troops have begun another idvance and Petrograd reports fightng in Volyhuia and in Galicia. The tussians also have seized a series of eights in the Carpathians and are ooving westward along the Rumanian order of Bukowina. Petrograd claims ne capture of about 16,000 prisoners. A withdrawal of the Austro-German nes South of the Zlota-Lipa-Dnlester sction is recorded by Berlin. Progress the Russians, West of Tarnopol is imitted, but Russian attacks in the urpathians and near Lutsk were relsed. Berlin says.


