Washington County Food Conservation Commission.

A committee of ten men, composed of business men and farmers of the county met with the Washington County Board of Agriculture at the Court House on Monday afternoon to formulate plans whereby the farmers and people in the county would be urged to increase the food production in the county. This committee of ten are men selected as the advisory board of the Washington County Food Conservation Commission, which commission will work in co-operation with the Board of Agriculture, for the purpose of urging the increased production of food crops. This commission does not only propose to urge the growing of more food crops, but also to aid the farmers in getting seed for fall crops, formulate plans for mobilizing the idle labor, urge growing of better home gardens, aid in canning and conserving the surplus of such crops, and to aid in any other way possible for this increased production. This commission is open for any good suggestions in which they may be of service to the people in the county.

The plans this commission agreed upon Monday, was for two of each of the Food Commission, together with the township members of the board of agriculture and any other farmers that cared to, to make a canvass of the county by townships, to urge the growing of more food and feed crops. This commission has set apart next Tuesday, May 15th, to go over the county to visit each and every farm in the county in the interest of the increased food production.
