



CULTIVATION OF DASHEEN INCREASING

Dasheen Plants Shown Growing in Field Near Brooksville, Fla.

The dasheen, a root crop introduced

into this country from Tripidad within recent years by the United States department of agriculture, is now grown by a considerable number of farmers and truckers in the South, and promises to become a valuable member of the group of domestic vegetables such as the potato which furnish starchy foods. The new vegetable is closely related to the taro, which is an important factor in the food supply in portions of the tropics. The dasheen is itbe grown successfully, however, not only in the warmer portions of Florida. but in other sections of the South as far north as South Carolina. The edible portion of the plant includes a large cellent stock feed. central corm and a number of tubers, of much smaller size, attached to and





Many cases of infestation by parasites is charged up to hog cholera. Too little attention is paid to parasitic ods, which may be had on application. troubles. As to the arsenic treatment for kidney worms, there is much dispute about its efficiency. Many breeders use the straight arsenic, the form known as arsenous acid being most commonly employed. It is given in 10 to 20-grain doses. A tenspoonful of arsenic would be a sufficient dose for a half dozen average-sized hogs. Care should be exercised in its use, and it ought to be stirred into slop, or If mixed with mashes care should be taken that the mixture is quite complete. Some seem to think that where arsenic is beneficial, the parasites are not located in and around the kidneys, but rather on account of the purging and vomiting produced by large-sized doses of arsenic, the parasites are located in the stomach and intestines, or the bile ducts of the liver. Excessive purging thought to have a beneficial action. A each hog twice or three times daily for a period of eight or ten days should be given. The best method, however, of handling conditions of this sort is to keep the animals away from infected feed and pens. If they feed on acorns,

keep plenty of copperas and charcoal, especially charcoal, convenient for them to eat. The formula for parasites in general has given very good results.



Government Issues Warning **Against Fly Poisons**

Following is an extract from "The Transmission of Disease by Flies," Supplement No. 29 to the Public Health Reports, April, 1916.

"Of other fly poisons mentioned, mention should be made, merely for a purpose of condemnation, of those composed of arsenic. Fatal cases of polsoning of children through the use of such compounds are far too the of such compounds are far too frequent, and owing to the resem-blance of arsenical poisoning to summer diarrhea and cholera in-fantum, it is believed that the cases reported do not, by any means, com-prise the total. Arsenical fly-destroying devices must be rated as extremely dangerous, and should never be used, even if other meas-ures are not at hand."
