Dangers of Watered Coffee

Watered stock, watered mills and watered coffee—the United States Government is carrying on a crusade to eliminate all three.

Everyone knows about watered stock. Everyone has seen "blue milk," the combined efforts of a cow and the old pump. But not everyone is on his guard against "watered coffee."

That the United States Government realizes the danger of watered coffee is shown by the specifications for the United States Army supplies. These specifications say plainly:

"Coffee: roasts must be 'dry' roasts, no water being permitted before, during or after the process of roasting."

Water in coffee is a piece of dishonesty practiced by unscrupulous coffee roasters. They turn the hose on the coffee while it is being roasted, so that it won't lose weight, as coffee will, when properly roasted. In roasting, coffee should lose about 10% of its weight. If it is watered it loses but 4%. The difference, of course, is water, for which you pay coffee value.

This is adulteration and nothing more. The water-logged coffee is rank and unhealthy. Of course, it is not honest to charge for coffee, and sell coffee beans soaked in water.

A lot of watered coffee is being sold no doubt right in this town. It is more often met with in the lower priced grades of bulk coffee.

As coffee is such an important beverage, pure food authorities are advising housewives to use the greatest care in selecting their coffee. The pure food experts say that the best way to avoid watered coffee is to buy some reliable packaged brand, roasted by a reputable coffee roaster as Arbuckle Brothers of New York.—Adv.

The Believer and His Sin

A Study in the First Epistle of John

The First Epistle of John might well be called the Epistle of Assurance, for it tells us certain things that we may know, and how we may know them.



Lord Jesus Christ it is said, "I write unto you, little children, because your sins are forgiven you for his name sake" (2:12).

Perhaps someone reading these words has never had his sins forgiven. He is carrying the burden of his guilt and knows nothing of the joy and peace in believing in the Lord Jesus Christ. To such a one comes the words of Paul, "Be it known unto you therefore, men and brethren, that through this man is preached unto you the forgiveness of sins: And by him all that believe are justified from all things, from which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses" (Acts 13:28-29). It is possible, you see from this, for an unbeliever to believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and have at once the forgiveness of sin and to know that his sins are forgiven him.

The Way of Cleansing.
Then notice next that this epistle tells us of the provision made for the believer's cleansing from the defilement of sin. This is set before us in the first chapter, seventh verse, where we read, "The blood of Jesus Christ, his Son, cleanseth us from all sin." The word "cleanseth" makes it clear that there is a continual process ever going on in the believer's life by which he is made clean from sin. In two ways God has provided for the believer's cleansing: First, through the blood of Jesus Christ; and, secondly, through his Word. We have the first method mentioned above; the second, when Jesus said to his disciples, "Now are ye clean through the word which I have spoken unto you," and in Ephesians five, where we read of the "washing of the water by the word." The ever-present cleansing, which is the believer's through the blood of Christ, is perpetual in its effect and assures him that before God in Christ he is cleansed.

Complete Deliverance.
Then we come to the third fact, which tells us how we may be delivered from the power of sin. "These things write I unto you that ye may not sin" (Revised Version 2:1). When we face this truth we face one of the most solemn truths in the Word of God. We may have been afraid of it because we have known certain teaching that has led into grave error, and as a result we draw back when anyone talks about the possibility of the believer not sinning, but what is the significance of this expression "may not sin," if it does not mean that there is for the believer deliverance in this life from the power of sin.

It is very evident from the context that the apostle is not teaching the eradication of sin when he says "may not sin," for he says, "if we say we have no sin (that is the root or principle of sin) we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us." But in the face of this fact that sin is in us, the apostle says "these things write I unto you that ye may not sin." By this he means the practice of sin, and so he thus sets before us the possibility of the believer being delivered from the practice of sin. Well may we ask, "How?" The answer is, "through Christ."

Our Advocate.
But what if we should sin, is there any provision for us? Yes, says the apostle, "if any man sin we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous" (2:1). This blessed provision is made not that we may sin, but in case we do sin. Just as the lifeboats are placed on the transatlantic liners not that they may go down, but for use in case they do go down; and so if we fall into sin, the apostle tells us what to do in the words: "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1:9). Our part in the restoration into fellowship is to confess our sin, remembering that before God stands our Advocate who pleads our case.

Food, Feed and Fertility.
Food, feed and fertility are the foundation of safe farming, according to the United States department of agriculture. Let us feed the people, feed the live stock and feed the soil. When we have done these three things, then also such acreage in money crops as we have the labor to tend.

EUROPE FOR CLEAN MOVIES

Foreign Countries Are Buying Much Film From America, but Suggest Change in Its Character.

We are so habituated to seeing indecent plays, suggestive 'movies' and women in scant drapery that we have lost the proper sense of proportion morally. 'Less of the sexual problem,'" says Europe. The message is a good one from a people who are being made better, cleaner, truer as they are tried in the fire of war.—Financial America.

TAMMANY IS 128 YEARS OLD

Famous Political Organization of New York Was Founded by William Mooney, an Upholsterer.

Tammany is 128 years old. On May 12, 1789, William Mooney, an upholsterer, who previously had been active as one of the Sons of Liberty, founded in New York what was intended to be a patriotic and social organization, the secret society of St. Tammany, or Columbian order, which in 1805 was regularly incorporated as a fraternal aid society.

It was divided into 13 tribes, each of which had its separate totem. The officers became known as the grand sachem, the sachem, the sagamore, or master of ceremonies, and the wiskinski, or doorkeeper.

In 1811 the society built its first hall, and in 1807 moved to Tammany hall, in Fourteenth street, where it has been ever since. Early in its history Tammany began to take an active part in politics. Aaron Burr is supposed to have been its tutor in the ways of politics, and in 1800 the society took part in its first campaign, being instrumental in carrying New York for Thomas Jefferson.

The name Tammany is adapted from that of an Indian chief, Tamanend, of the Delaware tribe, who was famous for his virtue and wisdom. He died in 1740 and was buried in New Britain township, Bucks county, Pennsylvania. Tammany was one of the earliest social organizations in America. The members in the early days were accustomed to dress in Indian costume.

Telegraphing With the Voice.
A telegraph "sender" has been experimentally perfected which the operator works with his voice instead of his fingers. In place of raising and depressing his sending key he sends his dots and dashes by modulating his voice to produce long and short intervals. The principle of the sender is the same as that of the ordinary type. In the usual senders the raising and depressing of the key opens and closes the circuit to produce the dot and dash. In the new type a delicate diaphragm is so arranged that the vibrations in the air set up by the voice open and close the circuit as in a telephone and produce the same results.
