

### Peach Growing in North Carolina.

The growing interest in peach production in North Carolina and the resulting demands on the staff of the Agricultural Experiment Station for information in regard to this matter has caused the Department of Agriculture to issue "Peach Growing in North Carolina", bulletin number 227. This bulletin gives some valuable facts in regard to the production, fertilization, cultivation, pruning, and spraying of peaches. It also points out the main facts in regard to successful peach production as found by the large commercial orchards in the State.

The bulletin is extremely timely just now when a maximum crop seems to be set on the trees. It is important that this crop be kept without rotting or spoiling by the attacks of insect enemies or fungus diseases so that it may be canned or dried for further use as food. The bulletin may be obtained on request by any citizen of the State and further facts in regard to the peach industry may be had on application to the Division of Horticulture, Department of Agriculture, Raleigh.

#### NOTICE OF LETTING CONTRACT.

The Board of Drainage Commissioners of Albemarle Drainage District (Beaufort County Drainage District No. 5) will on Monday, June 18th, 1917, at ten o'clock in the forenoon at the office of Small, MacLean, Bragaw & Rodman, attorneys for the said district, receive bids, either as a whole or in sections, as they deem most advantageous for the district for the work of construction of the proposed improvement consisting of a main canal seventeen laterals and two sublaterals as outlined in the final report of engineer and viewers filed with the Clerk of Superior Court of Beaufort County on April 11, 1917, together with certain incidental work as therein specified.

The estimated excavation of main canal is 612,253 cubic yards and of laterals 2,540,880 cubic yards.

The intercepting canal is also to be enlarged and cleaned out as specified in said report, and estimated at 33,300 cubic yards; certain fills and bridges are also to be constructed as described in said report.

The contract will be based on the plans and specifications submitted by the engineer and viewers in their final report, and as confirmed by the court, the original of which is on file in the office of the Clerk of Superior Court of Beaufort County, and is open to the inspection of all prospective bidders; but the Board reserves the right to correct errors and modify the details if, in their judgment, they can increase the efficiency of the drainage plan thereby without increasing the estimated cost. The entire work must be complete within three years from June 15, 1917, and the contractor will be required to give credit and pay for the work heretofore done at the contract price.

Any further information will be furnished by said attorneys or by F. M. Edgerton, Supt. of construction, Belhaven, N. C.

Bidders will be required to deposit check for \$1000.00 as a guarantee of good faith, and the contractor will be required to give bond in an amount to be fixed by the Board.
