"THE BIRTH OF A NATION" COMING TO WILLIAMSTON.

It will be welcome news to dwellers hereabouts that D. W. Griffith's gigantic military spectacle, "The Birth of a Nation," is to be presented at the Gayety Theatre, Williamston, exactly as

All the reserved seat tickets are dated and good only for the performance specified. Mail orders are now being accepted and patrons ordering seats by mail are cautioned to specify which performance they desire to attend. Mail orders must also be accompanied by remittance, payable to theatre, together with a self-addressed envelope to be used in forwarding the tickets.

The night performance will begin at 8:15 and the matinee at 2:30. The prices will be Night, lower floor, \$1.50, balcony, \$1.00; Matinee, lower floor, \$1.00, balcony, \$1.00.

Patrons, when ordering tickets, are requested to bear in mind that the government has levied a war tax of ten per cent. on all tickets for amusements and the law specifically states that "this tax must be paid by purchaser of ticket."
