WHAT THE NEW QUAR--ANTINE LAW REQUI-RES OF. CITIZENS OF THIS COUNTY.

Do you know what is required of you by the new State Quarantine Law ? It requires parents or householders to report every case of whooping cough., measles, diphtheria, smallpox, scarlet fever and typhoid fever occur called on to attend to the county within twenty-four hours. It requires public school teachers to fill out and return the blanks furnished them by the coupty quarantine officer, and to follow the rules and regulations sent to protect them and their schools in case of an outbreak of any contagious disease. It requires disease has been reported a pellow placard with the name of the disease printed on it with instructions for posting the placard on the front of the house : it requires him to send instructions for the treatment and con trol of the patient in the house. The quarantine officer is required to enforce the quarantine law and to make it give the protection for which it was intended. : Counties reporting many oases of contagious discases are given credit for doing good work. It shows that the people are cooperating with the quarantine officer and are reporting all or a great many of their cases. It slows that they are interested in reducing illness and saving the lives of little children, and it means that there will be fewer deaths to report later on.

The names and addresses of those having had a case of contagious disease during the month of Soptember, which were reported to me, are printed below, If you know of other cases whose
