CANNING FISH ROE.

Prepare the roe as for cooking. Pack in cans to within an inch of the top. Add one teaspoonful of salt. Seal, exhaust 15 minutes, tip, and return to canner for processing one hour. Repeat the processing (1 hour each day) on the second and third days. Canning Roe in Glass. For glass quart jars. Exhaust for 30 minutes, seal and process for 1 1/2 hours a day for three days. 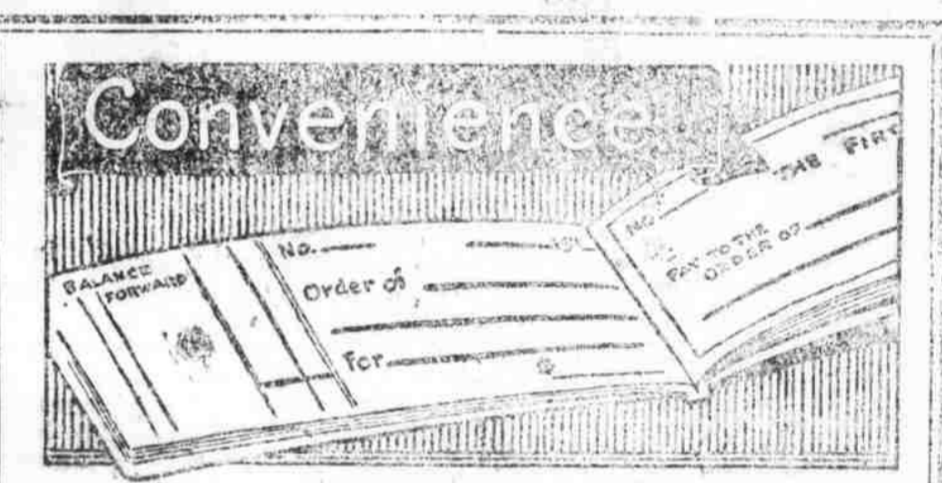
