GREAT NEED FOR LARGE WHEAT ACREAGE.

West Raleigh, N. C., August 21st.—Though North Carolina increased its wheat acreage nearly ten percent last year in answer to a request from the Federal Government and Agricultural Extension Service, there is still a great need for a still further increase and the extension workers have set out to have the acreage grow up another ten percent this season. Last year there were actually planted, according to crop estimates, 1,179,000 acres of wheat in the state. This was 1,000 acres less than was requested. This fall the desired acreage is 1,297,000 acres and the College and Department workers have set out as this as a goal for N. C.

In a recent letter to the County Agents of the Extension Service announcing the campaign, Director B. W. Kilgore has outlined just what is to be done and instructed these men to bend every energy to putting the campaign across. He has suggested that every farmer planting less than ten acres last year, be asked to put in one additional acre this year and that every man planting over ten acres last year, plant one additional acre for every ten acres put in.

More important than more acres of growing more wheat, Director Kilgore suggests that the average yield per acre be increased. This is around 15 bushels in North Carolina and around 10 bushels in other sections. The proper preparation is followed and these crops are properly cared for, a

reason why North Carolina's average yield may not be increased. It is very important that these things be given attention for more wheat is needed and North Carolina should not be in the humiliating position of having to beg bread of her sister states next season. She should have some to spare.
