Our New Road Law.

The new road law for Transylvania as given in the News last from the old order of things.

In addition to any political significance that may be attached to the new road law, it will be both commended and disapproved by men of all parties, and for several reasons in that it is a bill touching an important subject. The law represents ripe judgment in a number of its phases and probably oversights in others.

While some will object to conferring full road authority upon appointive officers and taking such out of the hands of the county commissioners, who were elected to take charge of such matters, others see in this a wise provision and a long stride toward progressive road building.
