CIVIL CASES TRIED IN SUPERIOR COURT

Superior court adjourned on last Friday after a term of two weeks. The first week was occupied in trying criminal cases and several were disposed of, lists of them being given in the last two issues of the News.
The civil docket was taken up on Monday and an unusually large number of cases met with final disposition.
Judge Lane changed the sentence of 90 days given Jake McCall for retailing to a fine of \$50 and costs, requiring the filing of a \$100 bond for good behavior and his appearance at each term of the court for the next five years to show that he had not been drunk nor sold whiskey.
The following civil cases were tried:
W. R. Orr vs. Stella Orr, divorce granted.
Howard Erwin vs. Lela Erwin, colored, divorce granted.
O. W. Clayton vs. Southern Railway Co., action dismissed and plaintiff taxed with costs in two cases. In another case plaintiff was awarded \$300 and defendant taxed with the costs. In a fourth case the plaintiff received judgment for \$12.
J. M. Hamlin vs. Southern, judgment for \$80 in favor of plaintiff.
A. E. Duckworth vs. Gloucester Lumber company, action dismissed.
Edwin Poor vs. Southern and Jack Poor by next friend against the Southern; cases consolidated, action dismissed, defendant attorney's fee of \$25.
M. F. Galloway vs. Southern, judgment against plaintiff, who was taxed with costs.
R. E. Poe & Co. vs. Town of Brevard, judgment against town for \$7,845 06 and costs.
Miller Supply Co. vs. F. L. Wesley, action dismissed.
C. A. Wood vs. E. H. Jennings, three cases, compromise.
T. D. England vs. G. E. McGaha, judgment of justice confirmed.
Judgments against the defendants for lands in controversy were entered in the cases of the Brevard Land & Timber Co. against T. W. Petit, A. M. Paxton, J. B. McCall and others.
The Manson-Campbell Co. vs. C. M. Doyle; plaintiffs taxed with costs.
Vance Brown and Brevard Land and Timber Co. vs. A. S. Owens, Pink Kilpatrick and others; judgment against defendants for land in controversy.
Brevard Lumber Co. vs. Charlie Jensen, judgment in favor of plaintiff for \$61.50.
Wm. P. Welt vs. J. E. Clayton, justice's judgment for \$63.98 confirmed.
Louis Carr vs. C. H. and W. A. Rexford and S. T. Graves, judgment for \$595 in favor of plaintiff.
