CONFESSED ENTERING COX AND KILPATRICK'S

James Thomas, Colored Identified by Bloodhounds Confessed to Entering Cox and Kilpatrick's Store.

The store of Cox & Kilpatrick was forcibly entered and robbed of some of its contents on Sunday night. James Thomas, a colored laborer at the Transylvania Tanning company's plant, was arrested on the afternoon of the next day, and is in jail.

The discovery that the store had been entered was made early Monday morning. Immediately Sheriff Paxton was notified and A. N. Taylor of Asheville, the bloodhound trainer, was sent for.

The store had been entered by removing a large pane of glass, 32 by 45 inches, from one of the front windows. This was accomplished by boring through the window frame and the edge of the glass, causing it to break in sections. Entrance had evidently been attempted at the side door, as a few holes had been bored through the panel near the lock.

The stock of goods in the store had been disturbed, many articles being thrown about in confusion. The thief had evidently eaten all the crackers and sardines he wanted and made away with some garments of underwear and two pairs of shoes. An estimate of the value of the things stolen was hard to make.

The bloodhounds, on being given the scent, took up the trail, which eventually led them up the Toxaway road. Sheriff Paxton, who went with the trainer and the dogs, sent word ahead about the pursuit, and a young man named Currie Galloway stopped and held a suspicious negro a short distance above Rosman. He was identified by the hounds on their arrival and was arrested by the sheriff.

Thomas confessed to the crime, but implicated no one else. He said that he had first broken into a house at the tannery and procured the tools which he had used to enter the store.

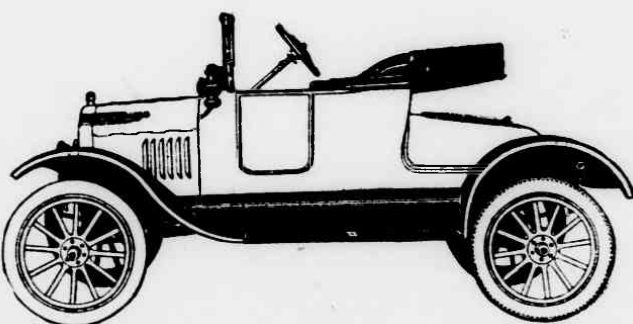

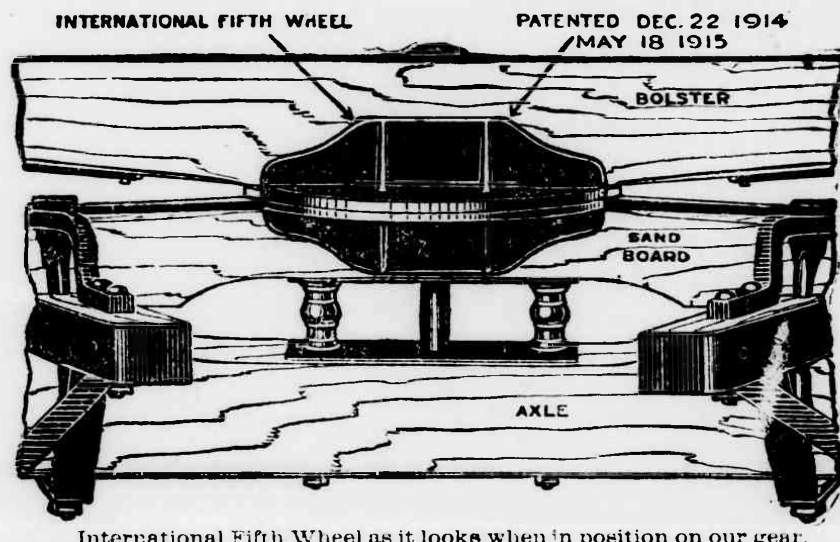

Distributes the strain on the front bolster and sandboard. Exceptionally strong with large wearing surfaces. The top plate is wider than the lower plate, thus preventing dirt from getting between.

Supports the bolster while the front gear is turned either to the right or left. Does away with the chuck, chuck motion of the front gear. The old style sandboard and bolster plates (size about 3x10 inches) do not furnish a good support for the bolster, which has to sustain the load when the front gear is turned either way, causing the following trouble:

Bolster strikes supporting iron and bends it down. Pulls sandboard and bolster plate loose on account of the chucking motion. Bolster dropping sideways forces the wagon box to follow, causing the sides of the box to split and the rivets to be pulled loose.

By the chucking motion the king bolt increases the size of the holes in the bolster plates, thereby adding to the unsteady drawing of the front gear, and creating heavy draft.

Causes broken bolster or sandboard, broken or bent king bolt.
