LAST BATCH OF CASES IN SUPERIOR COURT

Superior court which has been in session two weeks, wound up the remainder of the civil docket last week, adjourning on Saturday. The cases disposed of besides those published last week were as follows:

J. E. Duckworth et al vs Gloucester Lumber company and Edith S. Vanderbilt; judgment for plaintiffs in the sum of \$1,000.

J. H. Pickelsimer, executor, et al, vs. T. W. Whitmire et al; defendants having paid the note sued upon with interest and costs of this action, plaintiff takes non suit.

W. L. Frady vs. Wales Mull; judgment \$60 against defendant, and costs on each side to be paid by respective parties.

Brown-Patton Co., corporation, vs. Southern Contracting Co., corporation, and John C. Arbogast; judgment that the plaintiffs have and recover of defendants or either of them \$881.18 with interest and cost of action.

J. H. Benfield vs. Rosman Tanning Extract Co.; action dismissed.

Virginia Carolina Chemical Co. vs. J. E. Clayton; defendant having failed to carry up and docket his appeal at said term, appeal dismissed at cost of defendant.

Gloucester Lumber Co. vs. F. L. Wesley; plaintiff takes voluntary non suit.
