# FEED FOR YOUNG PIGS.

Grain Mixture That Has Given Good Results In Experiments.

Before weaning young pigs it is well to accustom them to a grain mixture or a slop of sweet milk combined with grain. The Pennsylvania State college agricultural experiment station has obtained excellent results with a grain mixture of commeal, four parts; wheat middlings, three parts, and tankage, one part. The addition of skimmilk increases the rate of gain. If skimmilk is fed with this grain mixture the amount of cornmeal may be increased to six parts. Other mixtures recommended are commeal, eight parts, and tankage, one part, or skimmilk, three parts, and corn meal, one part.

If possible pasture crops should be used for growing pigs. For quick growth of pigs two to four pounds of grain per hundred pounds live weight daily in addition to pasture crops is required. The amount of grain fed should be governed largely by the appetite of the pigs. They should be fed all they will consume without waste twice daily

The popularity of milk goats in the west has led the California experiment station to conduct an official test of their milk producing capacities. A twoyear-old pure Toggenburg produced in one year 2,158 pounds of milk and 72.8 pounds of butter fat. 
