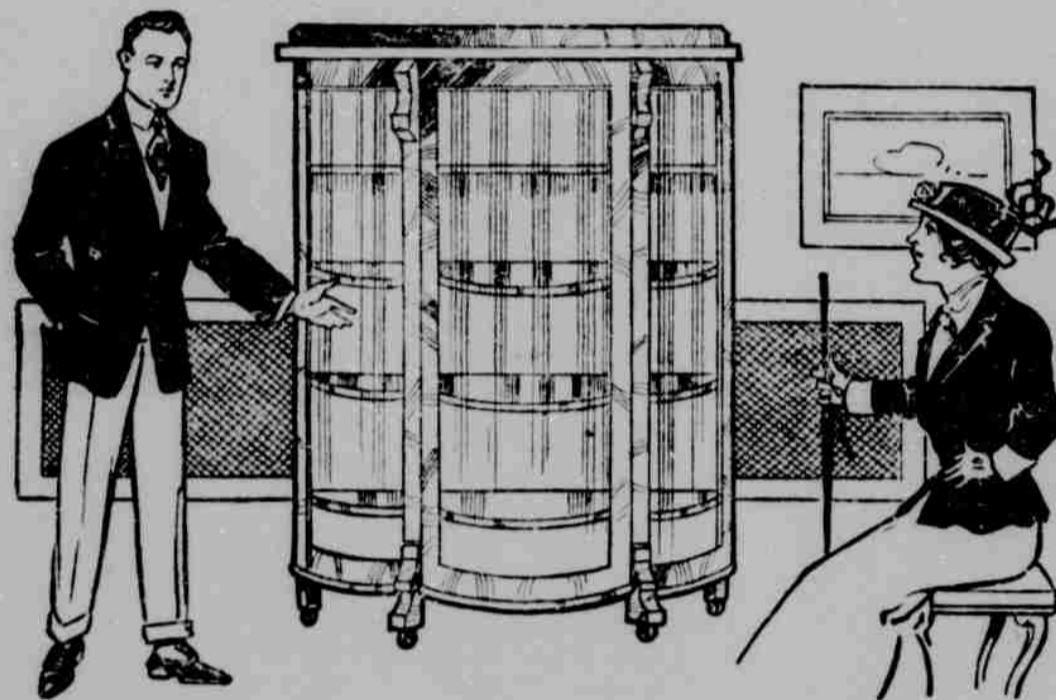

CONSERVATION OF COAL

If each user of a furnace or stove will take the cinders, as they drop into the ashpan, out daily, or several times daily and mix them with a little water so as to make thoroughly moist, these cinders and ashes can be used just the same as coal, by putting them on a hot fire thinly, and will be consumed just the same as if coal were used, and, in fact, will make a hotter fire and will result in the saving of at least
