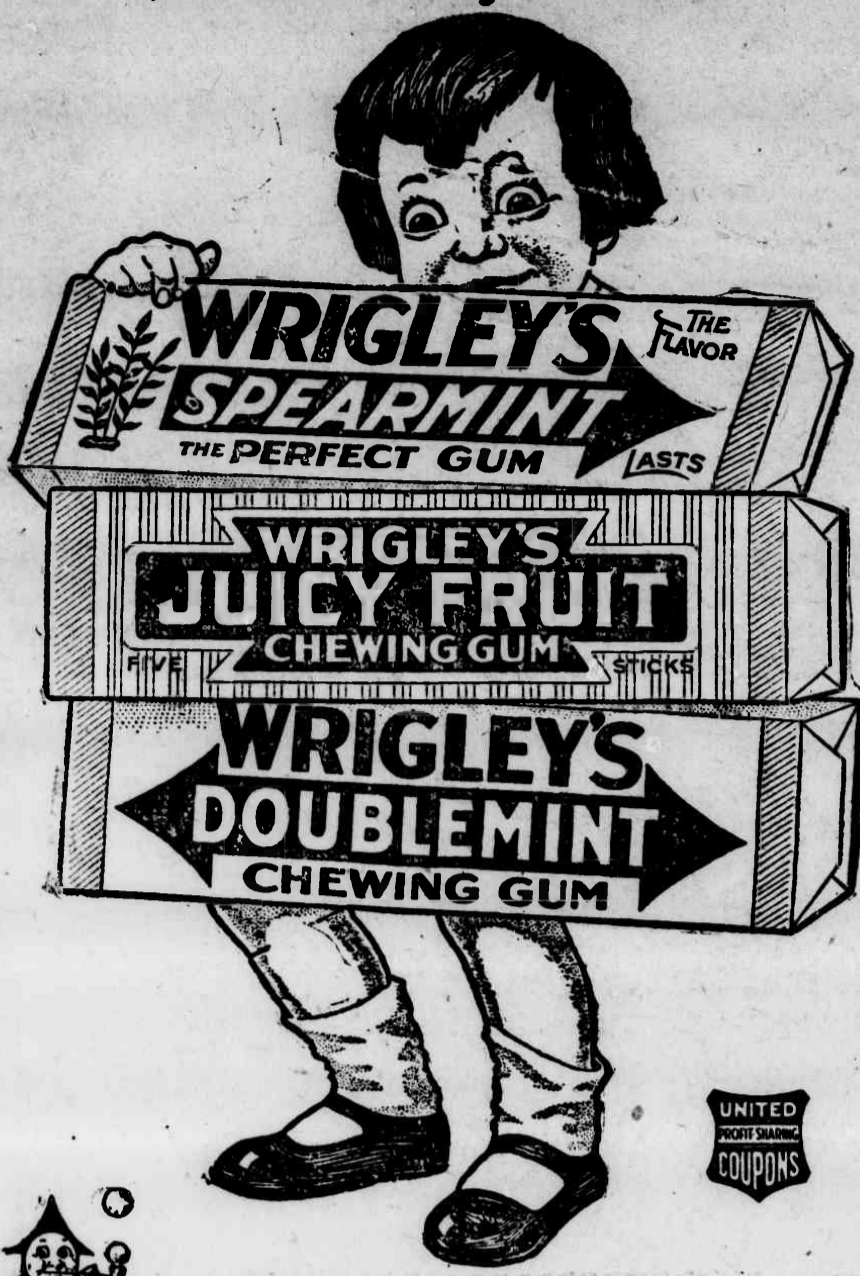

College Educations are Made Possible By Government Plan

Director of War Loan Organization of This District is Anxious to Explain Method to All Who Are Interested and He Invites Requests for Information.

Perhaps in no other thing is Uncle Sam more interested than in the future of America in the citizens of tomorrow—the children of today—and he consequently realizes the tremendous importance of inculcating in the minds of the children the principles of thrift and enkindling in their hearts a desire to improve their condition in life.
