RURAL CARRIER EXAMINATION

The United States Civil Service has announced an examination for the County of Transylvania, N. C. to be held on Dec. 12, 1919 at Brevard to fill the position of rural carrier at

Pisgah Forest and vacancies that may later occur on rural routes from other post offices in the above-mentioned county. The examination will be open only to citizens who are actually domiciled in the territory of a post office in the county and who meet the

other requirements set forth in Form No. 1977. Admission of women will be limited to the widows of U. S. soldiers, sailors, or marines, and to the wives of U. S. soldiers, sailors, or marines who are physically disqualified for examination by reason of in-

juries received in the line of military duty. This form and application blanks may be obtained from the offices mentioned above or from the United States Civil Service Commission at Washington, D. C. Applications should be forwarded to the Com-

mission at Washington at the earliest practicable date.

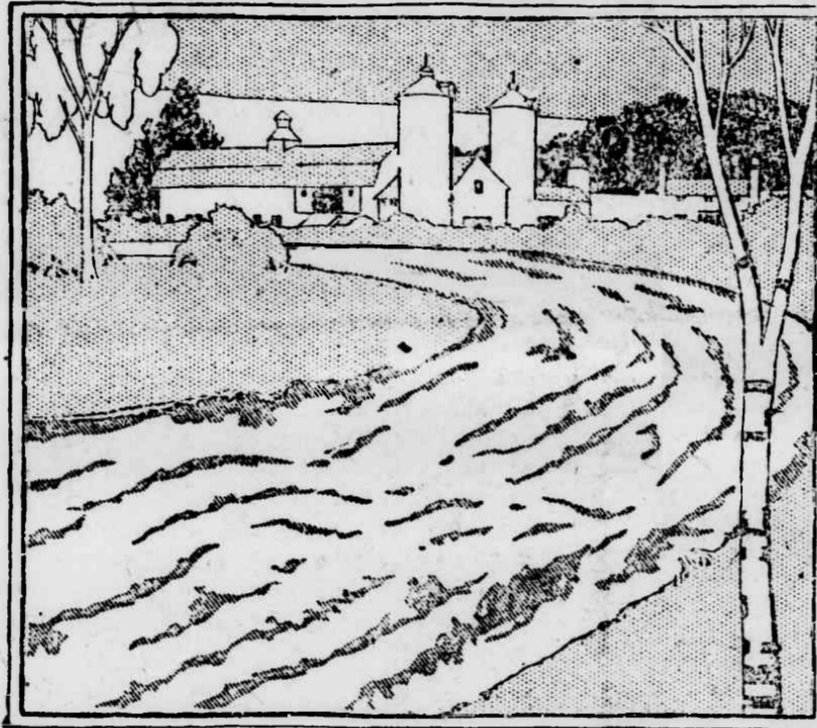

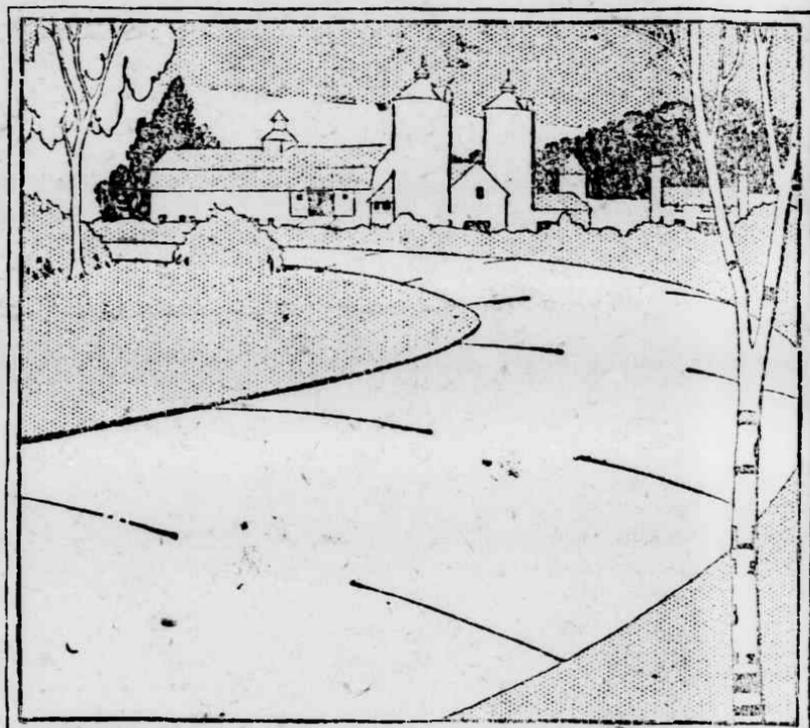
