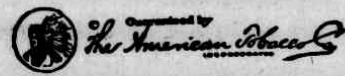

C. M. DOYLE DEMONSTRATES VALUE OF ADVERTISING.

The News is in receipt of the following clipping taken from Fort Worth Star-Telegram:

TRAFFIC RULES SUPPLIED BY AUTO DEALER

"C. M. Doyle, local dealer in Mitchell cars, has evidently had his ear to the ground regarding the new traffic regulations, for he admits having given considerable thought to the difficulties that the average motorist may have with the requirements of the new parking laws.

As a result of Doyle's study of the subject and his thoughtful sympathy with the motorist who wishes to comply with the law he offered to supply the City Traffic Department with a printed folder containing a copy of the official rules as they apply to the various streets.

Permission having been given him, Doyle had 10,000 of the folders printed at his own expense on yellow cardboard, being in conformity with the color of his "Yellow Front" Garage and sales rooms. Naturally, Doyle reserved the right to advertise his place of business on the reverse side of the cardboard with which he so generously supplied the City Traffic Department."




