Weekly Fashion Article

New York, March 7.—Originality is the outstanding feature of this season's mode. Fashions have not undergone any extraordinary changes, but the Paris openings, just closed, have shown us some new and sparkling ideas in clothes. Clothes are less standardized as to detail than they were last season. There is a more human, a more "dress-makerish" quality about them.

By this I don't mean that they look as if they had been made by loving hands and the aid of the village seamstress, but that they have a certain originality of detail and simplicity of cut that distinguishes the careful dressmaker-made costume from the shop costume.

Some Costumes are Sleeveless. The sleeveless frock has returned. The simple sleeveless jumper has reappeared, too. This new mode had its beginning this winter on the Riviera and at Palm Beach, where a coat of tan on the arm is worth two sleeves in a frock.

There are three variations of the short-sleeved ensemble. One is the sleeveless frock or jumper-frock worn with a sleeveless jacket. This is inevitably a summer costume, that will be more interesting later in the season. Another is the sleeveless jacket over a frock with sleeves. Several of the large Paris houses show this type for sports wear. A third, and most popular, and certainly less difficult to wear, is the sleeveless frock or jumper-costume worn under a jacket with sleeves.

The jacket of the ensemble saves the costume a formality that is the costume out of the tennis-frock class and makes it one that may be worn for "spectator sports," and when it is of suitable fabric, even for town wear.

Many Variations are Possible. This mode permits the use of many combinations of fabric and colors, combinations that have not been possible for several seasons. Fancy wools frequently form the jumper worn with a plain skirt that matches the coat. Jacket-like jumpers of velveteen or corduroy are worn with woolen skirts. One Paris house stripes its jumpers in color or embroiders them all over with floral designs in multicolors and combines these with short jackets and skirts of plain wool jersey, or crepe or crepe.

An example of the sleeveless costume-complete is made by Lenief, who shows a white, finely plaited Georgette crepe skirt, a sleeveless Georgette crepe jumper embroidered in white, and worn with these a white flat crepe cardigan jacket bordered with gold cloth. Lenief makes also colored jersey-cloth or tricot sleeveless jumpers to be worn with cashmere and novelty woolen skirts.

Not Always Sleeveless. Short jacket costumes are not always sleeveless. Doucet makes cardigan jackets of wool crepe worn with plented crepe skirts and matching scarfs. Short jacket suits with contrasting skirts are shown by several of the Paris houses. Short jackets of navy blue wool—and navy blue is extremely smart at the moment—are worn with skirts of checked or striped fabrics in blue and white or blue and gray. Often a jacket of this type has martingale or short belt across the back at the hip-line.

Hip jackets and short boleros are used on some of the new suits. These, of course, are more extreme and should be attempted only by the young and undoubtedly slender. An example of the type of Eton suit Paris is making is one shown by Bernard, a bit extreme, but decidedly smart. The Eton jacket is of black wool fabric, the skirt is green and the blouse worn with this combination is white. The costumes I have described are all pure types, outstanding examples
