"An order Authorizing the issuance of \$100,000 Bonds of the County of Transylvania, North Carolina, for School purposes."

"Be It Ordered by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Transylvania, as follows:  
"Section 1. Pursuant to the County Finance Act of North Carolina, bonds of the County of Transylvania, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$100,000, for the purposes hereinafter described.  
"Section 2. The proceeds of said bonds shall be applied solely to the funding of said indebtedness of the County of Transylvania incurred prior to March 7, 1927, for expenses necessarily incurred by said County, as an administrative unit of the public school system of the State, in the maintenance of public schools in said County at least six months in every year, as required by the Constitution of North Carolina; and it is hereby determined, after due investigation, that such indebtedness in an amount not less than \$100,000 is now outstanding and payable

It is understood that Rev. and Mrs. Stanberry and daughter, Miss Alma, will leave Asheville next week for their new home in the Michigan city.


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
