afternoon at the home of Mrs. Cordia King.

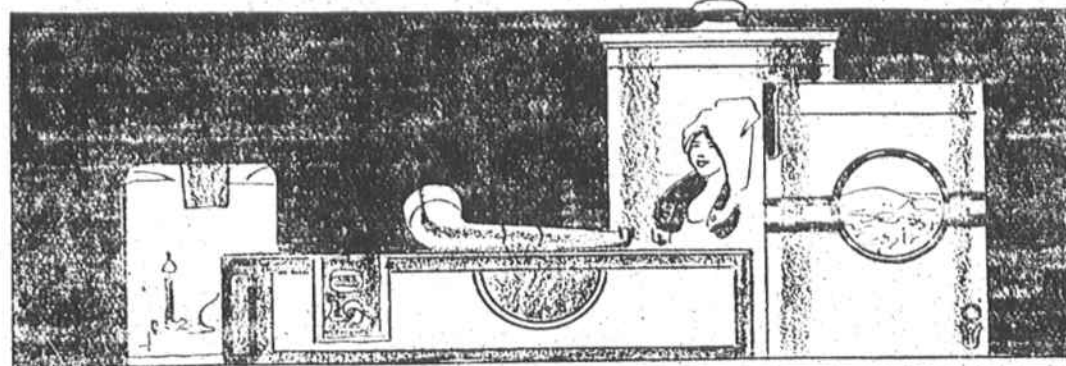
Included in the transaction of business was the vote of the club to renew their pledge of \$100 to the hospital fund, to be used in whatever way most needed.
