BANK ROBBERS GET AWAY WITH FUNDS

Friday \$25,000 were looted from the Bank of Pickens, Pickens, S. C. Friday morning by four unmasked men who held up the bank officials and fled with the money in an Oldsmobile Sedan. One of the robbers Robert McGills was captured Saturday by the South Carolina Police authorities with the aid of Sheriff T. E. Patton and Deputy Sheriff Tom Wood of this county.

The Oldsmobile sedan in which the robbers made their first getaway was found on the side of the road at East Fork near the old Hendrix house. It was noticed that the machine had no license tags and that the serial number had been filed from the engine, this indicating that it may have been stolen.

The three escaped bandits are believed to have fled to points unknown and police authorities, insurance detectives and other police authorities are working on the case at this time. The bank was fully covered with insurance and the depositors will not be the losers. Very little information could be gained from McGill, the captured man.
