295 Enroll At W. C. T. C.

For This Year

Approximately 295 students enrolled at W.C.T.C. for this school year. Of this number 126 enrolled in the freshman class and 22 students were transfers from other colleges. It is expected that the total enrollment mark will reach 300.

Dean W. E. Bird states that there is a considerable increase in the number of men students, over the war years. He also made known that there is enough male students this year to justify planning for football practice. Coach Marion McDonald, who has been in the service for three years is expected to arrive shortly to help formulate definite plans for a football program. He will receive a discharge.

Six new faculty members have been added to the teaching staff at the college and in this first year of peace the prospects for the school is very bright.
