Jackson County Chapter Of American Red Cross

Traveling 14,300 miles and making 13,200 calls since December, 1941, the Jackson County Chapter of the American Red Cross has rendered indispensable aid to the service men of Jackson county and their families. Acting as a go-between from the home of the service man and his point of service, hundreds of boys have been contacted whose families had had no word in months. They have assisted service men in getting to and from their post of duty and by authority of the Post Commander have made loans to care for emergency furloughs. They assist wives whose husbands have been killed in service in getting the pension. Through the National Service Life Insurance Service they assist in Insurance Adjustments.

Though the untiring efforts of Mr. A. J. Dills, Secretary of the chapter, the Home Service Red Cross has filled all quotas for the county and in some cases surpassed the requirements. They have rendered service to each call that has been within their reach in helping the party concerned.

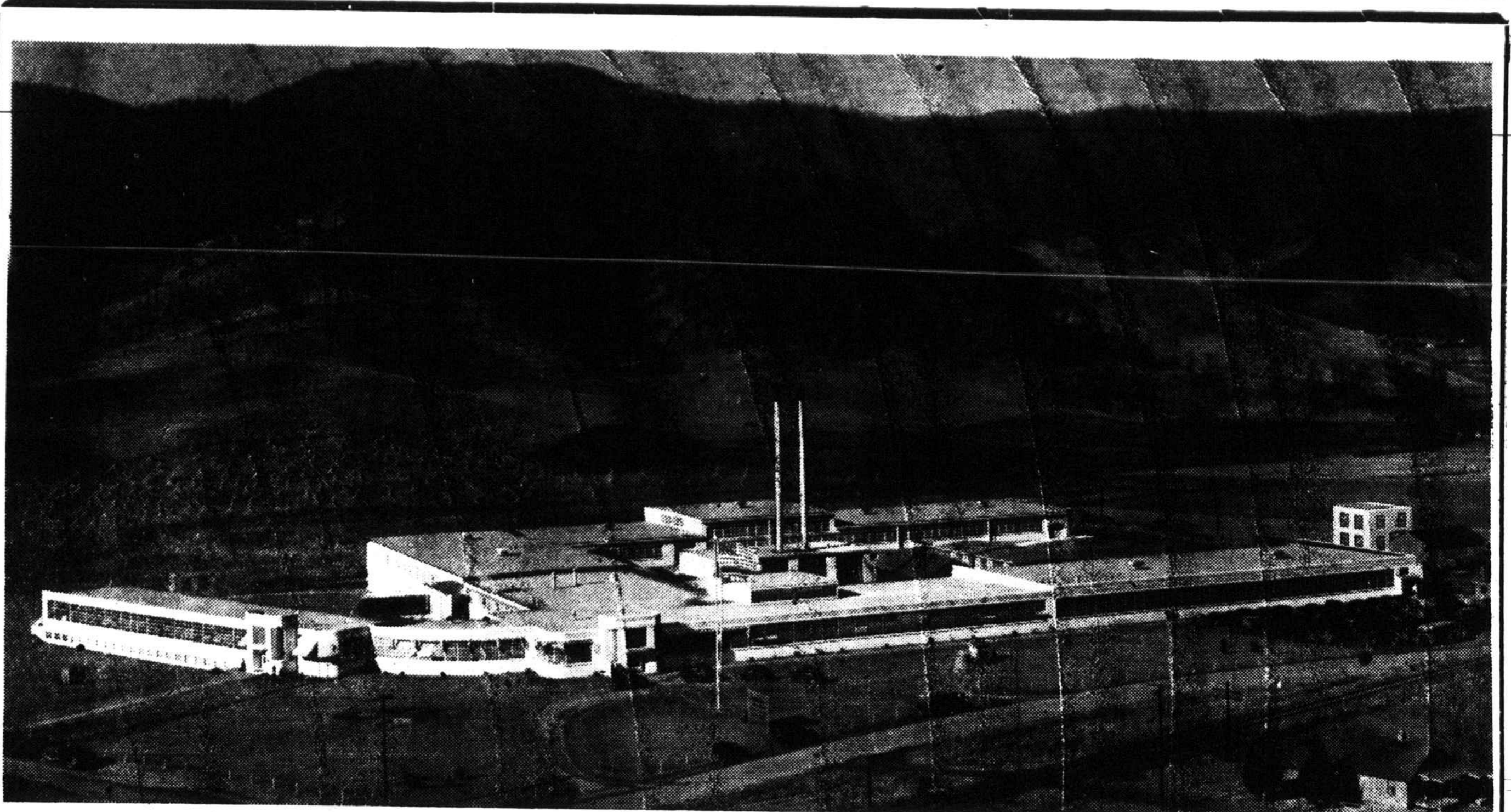
The following uncles were pallbearers, Will Ridley, Virco Hyatt, Reno Hyatt and Perley Hyatt.
