**WCTC Students To Build And Operate Campus Radio Station**

Cullowhee — Western Carolina Teachers college will have a radio station on its campus early next year. Plans for the station have been in the making since Phillip Hollifield, Robbinsville, conceived the idea for it early this fall, but there are still some difficulties to be ironed out before it can go into operation.

Frank Murray, Franklin, who was named temporary production manager by the members of the newly-founded Radio club, said that the station will broadcast on a frequency of 550 kilocycles. It will use the carrier-current system, and will use power lines on the campus for its antenna. Its range will be approximately 200 yards. The station, already constructed by Mr. Hollifield and John Ray Hill, Old Fort, is tentatively scheduled to be on the air one hour nightly, five days a week.

Members, Murray, Hollifield, and Hill went to Raleigh during the school holidays to confer with officials concerning the station and to study other college radio stations.

Dr. Carl D. Killian, head of the college's education department, will be faculty sponsor of the radio

Call letters have not yet been assigned. The group had wanted to use WCTC, the college's initials, but were told that another station has already been licensed to use those letters.

**Creel Limits Reduced For Trout And Crappie**

Raleigh, Dec. 8.—Removal of the size limit on mountain trout and reductions in creel limits for trout and crappie were approved by the North-Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission last week in setting up sport fishing regulations for next year.

After voting to take the seven-inch limit off trout, the Commission cut the limit on the daily from 12 to 10. The creel limit for crappie, both black and white, was reduced from 20 to 15.

The year-round open season for warm-water game fishes was continued, with the stipulation that, as last year, certain waters may be designated as spawning areas and set aside for protection of warm-water species during the

spawning season. These areas will be posted and advertised before being closed to anglers.

The mountain trout fishing season will be the same as in the past—April 15 through August 31.

In keeping with the policy it followed in adopting this year's hunting regulations, the Commission acted on the fishing rules only after giving sportsmen an opportunity to express their views at a public hearing.

Other fishing regulations were re-adopted. Size limits which remain in effect are: black bass, 10 inches; striped bass (rockfish), 12; muskallunge, 22; and wall-eye, 15. There are no size limits on other game fishes.

Creel limits, in addition to the

limit of 10 for trout and 15 for crappie, are: bass, eight; muskallunge, five; wall-eye, five; and other varieties of perch and sunfish, 20. The possession limit remains two days' creel limit.

The Commission voted to continue license requirements that were in effect this year. The regulations require licenses of all anglers over 16.

To clarify its jurisdiction, the Commission adopted a new definition of public fishing waters: "All ponds or lakes not classified as private shall be considered public fishing waters. Before any such impounded water may be drawn

off, a permit must be obtained from the director of the Wildlife Resources Commission or his duly authorized agent. All streams and rivers within which fish are free to move across property lines shall be considered as public waters, and the regulation of the fishing thereon subject to the regulations as approved by the Wildlife Resources Commission."
